



LOCAL RULES & TERMS OF THE COMPETITION

The Rules of Golf as approved by the United States Golf Association and the R&A govern play and where applicable, by the following Local Rules and Terms of the Competition. See applicable championship or qualifying round Notice to Players and Entry Application for modifications or additions to these Local Rules and Terms. Complete text of the Rules and Model Local Rules (MLR) in Section 8 of Committee Procedures may be found in the Official Guide to the Rules of Golf, effective January 2019. MLR's are shown by page number or latest USGA Clarification Update.

Unless otherwise noted, the penalty for breach of a Local Rule is the general penalty – two strokes in stroke play and loss of hole in match play.

LOCAL RULES

Out of Bounds - Defined by the line between the course-side points, at ground level, of white stakes and fence posts.

Penalty Areas – Rule 17.

- a) When a penalty area is defined on only one side, it extends to infinity. When a penalty area is connected to the out-of-bounds edge, the penalty area extends to and coincides with out of bounds.
- b) Relief on Opposite Side of Red Penalty Areas:
Red penalty areas with an opposite side relief option will be indicated on the applicable "Notice to Players". MLR B-2.1, Pg 455.
Note: When the edge of a red penalty area coincides with the boundary of the course, MLR B-2.2 is in effect and modifies the first paragraph of MLR B-2.1, Pg 455.

Ground Under Repair - Defined by white lines. French drains are ground under repair.

Relief from Seams of Cut Turf - MLR F-7, Pg 481 is in effect. (Relief from the seams but not the cut turf unless marked or defined).

White-Lined Areas Tying Into Artificially Surfaced Roads and Paths - White-lined areas of ground under repair and the artificially surfaced roads, paths or other identified obstructions that they are connected to are a single abnormal course condition when taking relief under Rule 16.1.

Wood Chips and Mulch - Are loose impediments.

Integral Objects - Include cables, rods, wires and wrappings when closely attached to trees, and artificial walls and pilings when located in penalty areas and bunkers.

Replacement of Club That is Broken or Significantly Damaged- Rule 4.1a (2) is modified to allow for replacement of a club broken or significantly damaged if damage was not due to abuse. Also see Rule 4.1b (4) and MLR G-9 (Jan 2020 update).

Ball Played From Outside Relief Area When Taking Back-On-The-Line Relief- The MLR E-12 is in effect. (Jan 2020 update).

Back- On -the-Line- Relief- Local Rule as prescribed in the Clarifications to the 2019 Rules of Golf is in effect. MLR E-12.

Limiting When Stroke Made From Putting Green Must Be Replayed Under Exception 2 to Rule 11.1b – Local Rule as prescribed in the Clarifications to the 2019 Rules of Golf is in effect. MLR D-7.

Code of Conduct - Committee may disqualify a player for acting contrary to the spirit of the game if it finds the player has committed serious misconduct, in accordance with Rule 1.2a. Penalties other than disqualification may be imposed for player misconduct, also in accordance with Rule 1.2a and Committee procedure 5H. Pg 414.

The Committee may apply the following penalty structure at its discretion: First Offence, warning; Second Offence, one-stroke penalty; Third Offence, general penalty; Fourth Offense or Serious Misconduct, disqualification.

Prohibiting Use of Caddies- MLR H-1.1. Pg 499 is in effect. (A player must not have a caddie during the round).

TERMS OF THE COMPETITION

When Competition is Final - The competition is final when the trophy has been presented to the winner or, in the absence of a prize ceremony, when all scores have been approved by the Committee. The result of a match is final when the Committee has approved the result as posted on the public scoreboard.

List of Conforming Driver Heads - MLR G-1, Pg 495 is in effect.

Grooves and Punch Mark Specifications – MLR G-2, Pg 495 is in effect, except as modified by the applicable championship Entry Application.

List of Conforming Golf Balls – MLR G-3, Pg 496 is in effect.

Pace of Play - See “Optimist Pace of Play” guidelines on the Optimist website or “Notice to Players”.

Stopping and Resuming Play – MLR J-1, Pg 503 is in effect.

All practice areas are closed during an immediate suspension for a dangerous situation until the Committee has declared them open. Players who practice on closed practice areas will be asked to stop practicing; failure to stop practicing might result in disqualification.

An immediate suspension will be signaled by one prolonged air horn note. All other types of suspension will be signaled by three consecutive air horn notes. Resumption of play will be signaled by two shorts notes.

Practice - Prior to and after a round in stroke play, a player may practice on the designated practice areas. Rule 5.2b covering practice in stroke play is modified in this way: A player may NOT practice on the competition course before or between rounds. See Model Local Rule I-1.1, Pg 502. Penalty for breach of Local Rule, see Rule 5.2.

Prohibiting Use of Motorized Transportation- Model Local Rule G-6, Pg 497 is in effect. (Players must walk unless riding is authorized by the Committee e.g., at designated shuttles points or when he/she will play, or has played, again under penalty of stroke and distance).

Ties- Weather and time permitting, ties for first place will be broken by a sudden death play-off starting at a hole determined by the Committee. All other ties will be broken in accordance with the USGA recommendation in Committee procedure 5A (6), Pg 402.
